I would like to highlight some of the problems that we encountered in the organization of the competition in 2012 and at the same time I'd like to thank Willi Grill and all the other Jury members who pointed out some problems and their successful resolution on great international competitions from World Cups to **Olympic Games:**

- Issue of the well-timed preparation of all technical details associated with
- implementing
- competition:

-control of possible shadows on the targets



- flag height for wind

- the level of the shooting places



- area for storage of arms and equipment in warehouses and on a shooting line



- procedure of equipment control and constant control of the instruments for

tests





- procedures of ADHOC control and organization of area for the implementation of this.

- area for Jury members and staff close to shooting facilities
 - examination of technical correctness of Shooting Range in all elements
 - organization of transport between the hotel accomodation and shooting facilities with a sufficient number of buses and at appropriate time schedule and schedule of events.







Changes in the 2013 Rifle Rules Malfunction Rules Keys to improved Competitions Range Officer& Jury Member Manuals



One Rifle Per Event.

Only one (1) rifle is allowed to be used in the competition or Finals



Movement or Oscillation Reduction Systems.

Any device,
mechanism or system that actively reduces, slows or
minimizes
rifle oscillations or movements before the shot is released
is
prohibited.

Is is an illegal active system to stabilise the barrel before the shot is fired, and for that we have to protect our athletes.





Electronic triggers

All components are firmly attached to and contained within the action or stock of the rifle so that the battery and wires are not visible externally;



The pistol grip extensions is 60mm








Butt Plate and Hook

not extend more
than 25 mm to the rear of this perpendicular line; and
Any devices or weights projecting forward from the lower
portion of the butt plate are prohibited.






Shooting Shoes

No special shooting shoes are allowed in the 50m prone event.

The shoe sole must follow the external curvature of the shoe and may not extend more than 5.0 mm beyond the external dimensions of the shoe at any point. Toes or heels may not be cut square or flat.

If a shoe has a sqare for example form the sole must be round






Shooting Jacket

The construction of the side panel may not place any horizontal seam or seams under the elbow of the support arm in the standing position.


The athlete must be capable of fully extending both arms (straighten sleeves) while wearing the buttoned jacket.





Shooting Trousers

No seat pad on trousers





Rifle Rests

The use of a rifle rest for resting the rifle between shots is permitted providing that it is not <u>no part of the stand</u> is higher than the athlete's shoulders when in <u>the standing position</u>.

A stand for resting the rifle must not be placed in front of the shooting table or bench in the standing position.

A kneeling roll may be used as a rifle rest.



Kneeling Heel Pad

A separate piece of flexible, compressible material with maximum

dimensions of 20 cm x 20 cm may be placed on the heel in the kneeling position. The kneeling heel pad may be no thicker than

10mm when compressed measured with the thickness device.

Visor or Cap

A cap or visor may be worn, but it must not touch or rest on the

rear sight while the athlete is shooting. The cap or visor may extend forward of the athlete's forehead no more than 80 mm and

may not be worn in a way that makes it a side blinder.



RIFLE EVENTS

50 m and 300 m three position events must be fired in order: Kneeling -- Prone - Standing.

A combined 15-minute Preparation and Sighting period must be provided before MATCH firing starts

No change over time anymore, is one total time...

Safety flags must be inserted in all rifles, pistols and semiautomatic

shotguns at all times other than during authorized dry firing or live firing on a firing point. The purpose of safety flags is to

visibly demonstrate when gun actions are open and guns are unloaded.







General and Administrative Facilities

One Main Scoreboard for posting official results and notices, and smaller Range Scoreboards on each range for posting preliminary results; a scoreboard should also be placed in the athletes rest area;

6.4.3.5 Each range must be equipped with a large clock at each end of the hall on which the time can clearly be seen by athletes and officials. The Finals range preparation area must also have a clock. Range clocks must be synchronized with results computers to show the same time. Rifle and Pistol Finals ranges must have a count-down clock that shows the time remaining for each shot.



Wind Flags for 50m Ranges and 300m Rifle Ranges

Wind flag height must correspond with the central area of the bullets' flight paths

Athletes must check the wind flags before the Preparation and Sighting Time starts to be sure they do not obscure their targets.

Only Range Officers or Jury Members may reposition wind flags.



Firing Point Equipment.

NO

chairs or stools for athletes may be placed on or near the firing points on Finals ranges;

Pre-Event Training (PET).

each athlete

must be allowed to train on his allocated competition

target for a

minimum of 40 minutes per relay (30 minutes per relay for

Rapid Fire Pistol) on the day before the event,



repair it and continue shooting or, if the malfunction was ALLOWABLE, continue shooting with another gun with the permission of the Jury and it has been approved by Equipment Control.

No extra competition time is allowed to repair or replace a gun after any malfunction in 10 m, 50 m and 300 m Rifle or Pistol Elimination or Qualification Rounds.


